Dear Senator McCain:

We appreciate your past leadership in working to diminish the role of big money and special interests in American politics. We also are pleased that you are making government reform a key issue in your presidential campaign.

We congratulate you on winning the Republican nomination for president. Should you win the general election, we strongly urge you to make public financing of presidential and congressional campaigns a top legislative priority for your administration. However, victory would afford you the opportunity to adopt several meaningful policies without the need for legislation. Today, we are asking you to endorse four policies that we believe remedy some of your longstanding criticisms of large political contributions and special interests. Specifically, we are asking you to promise that if elected president you will:

- Instruct your party not to allow soft money contributions (corporate, union or individual gifts beyond campaign contribution limits) to host committees or any other committees to be used for 2012 convention activities;
- Not permit your inauguration committee to accept soft money;
- Not appoint fundraisers or major contributors to ambassadorships, transition team positions, or other major posts in your administration except for those rare individuals who have demonstrated particular qualifications for the job in question; and
- Not accept contributions for a presidential library, foundation or other private entity until after your presidency ends.

We are sending a similar letter to Senator Obama and will be sending both letters to the moderators of the presidential debates. We look forward to hearing your response.
