## PUBLIC INTEREST VOTES IN THE STATE SENATE

- 1) Bisphenol-A (SB 213)** — Restricts the use of the chemical Bisphenol-A (BPA) in baby bottles and cups designed for children under the age of 4, starting in 2012.
- 2) Foreclosure due to delinquent municipal bills (SB 158)** — Would have prohibited the forced sale or foreclosure of a property due to unpaid water, sewer, or other sanitary system bills totaling less than \$750.
- 3) Transportation criteria (SB 760)** — Ensures that planners evaluate proposed state-funded projects against existing state transportation goals, which include safety and security, environmental stewardship, and repairing existing infrastructure.
- 4) False health claims (SB 279)** — Rewards whistleblowers of Medicaid fraud by giving them a share of the damages and allows the state to more aggressively pursue fraudulent claims.
- 5) Lead dust testing (SB 504)** — Would have ensured that a rental property underwent lead dust testing before a new tenant moved in to the property.

## PUBLIC INTEREST VOTES IN THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES

- 1) Bisphenol-A (HB 33)** — Restricts the use of the chemical Bisphenol-A (BPA) in baby bottles and cups designed for children under the age of 4, starting in 2012.
- 2) Pay day lending (HB 79)** — Closes loopholes that have allowed pay day lenders to impose interest rates up to 600 percent.
- 3) Foreclosure mediation (HB 472)** — Gives homeowners tools to help avoid foreclosure, including a new measure to permit homeowners to request third party mediation.
- 4) Credit card blacklisting (SB 523)** — Prevents credit card companies from adjusting customers' credit card terms based on the stores at which they shop.
- 5) Transparency in consumer arbitration (HB 379)** — Some contracts now require that consumers waive their right to sue in court. This bill would have increased the likelihood of receiving a fair hearing from third party arbitrators.
